The Johnson Ohana Charitable Foundation is a non-profit public charity founded in 2008 by Jack and Kim Johnson to promote positive and lasting change within communities by supporting organizations that focus on environmental, art, and music education.

2012 HIGHLIGHTS

The Johnson Ohana Charitable Foundation chooses a specific funding theme that varies periodically. Beginning in 2012, a new funding focus supports plastic free initiatives and efforts to reduce single-use disposable plastics. Grants also continue to support sustainable local food systems as well as hands-on environmental projects. To celebrate Earth Day 2012, a Double Your Impact partnership was created with DonorsChoose.org to match donations to "green" classroom projects including recycling, composting, waste reduction and creative plastic free & upcycling projects.

The Johnson Ohana Charitable Foundation continues to build relationships with grantees offering music and arts education for youth, primarily in California and Hawaii. In total, over \$424,000 was distributed in grants and donations in 2012.
